During my legal career and litigation practice, I have had the opportunity to work on a wide range of litigation matters and for a wide variety of clients. I have represented clients in both the public and private sectors. I have experience as an in-house counsel for a regional company, as well as the solicitor for municipal corporations (city, borough, township, and school district). I began my career putting myself through night school while working at the Allegheny County Law Department as a law clerk and certified legal intern where I appeared in court on behalf of CYS. In addition to the great start to my career with the County Law Department, I am fortunate to have worked for a national litigation law firm, mid-sized firms, and smaller firms. Accordingly, I have represented clients from large corporations and public entities to small business owners and individuals and have learned from each. I have successfully represented clients in complex commercial litigation, bankruptcy litigation, lease and contract litigation, led an oil & gas firm subgroup, litigated construction actions, both for a general contractor and for individual home owners, employment litigation claims, wills and estate litigation, land/property disputes and zoning litigation, ejectment actions, actions in quiet title, an

action in mandamus, foreclosure actions, and property conservatorship actions. I am experienced in petition practice and litigation re vendor issues including vendors for school districts and municipal clients.

10. Regarding your practice:

a) What has been the general character of your practice, dividing it into periods with dates if its character has changed over the years?

The general character of my practice has been litigation. Initially, I cut my teeth working on complex commercial litigation matters with DKW Law Group and then ten (10) years with Pepper Hamilton (Please see response to Question 9, above, for dates). After Pepper Hamilton, I went in-house to a new Oil and Gas Exploration and Production Company where I had a seat at the Board of Director and senior executive meetings. I worked with industry contracts and on dispute resolution strategies as well as managing employment and pre-litigation issues. I then continued to represent the Company in the private firm focusing on the land work. My practice's general character eventually turned to focus on smaller businesses, individual, and municipal clients with a broader and more general litigation practice which is, I believe, great training for a future judge of the Court of Common Pleas.

 - i. Hickenbottom v. Nassan, et al. (Western District of Pennsylvania; Civil Action Number.: 03-2007, before Judge Conti). This was a civil rights case regarding two state troopers whom we (Pepper Hamilton) represented. This case was particularly significant as it progressed from start to finish through the entire Federal Court Judicial Trial Process. Although not as the lead attorney, I actively participated in this matter through verdict and even conducted the direct examination of defendants' expert (Dr. Cyril Wecht) during trial.
 - ii. New Pig v. Buchanan Ingersoll. This was a professional malpractice case regarding a contract; This case was particularly significant as it was another

matter while I was with Pepper Hamilton that progressed through jury selection prior to settlement before openings. On a personal note, I had to defend a deposition for this case in Scotland.

- iii. Misitis v. Labash (Court of Common Pleas of Allegheny County; GD 20-004900), before Judge O'Brien); In this property conservatorship matter which is ongoing, I represent the Intervenor; This case is particularly significant because 11 days after evidence concluded, a Pennsylvania Superior Court Opinion was published addressing the exact issue before the Court in our case. The Court then asked for briefing as to whether the newly published Superior Court case applies to our case. My brief (which was filed with the Court) regarding this issue is attached hereto as a writing sample).
- iv. ACM v. D & D Wood Sales, Inc. (Court of Common Pleas of Indiana County; 11011-CD-2022, before Judge Force); In this breach of Lease action which is ongoing (trial completed, awaiting post-trial briefing schedule), I represented the Tenant of a piece of property where its facility is located. This case is significant as it presented another opportunity to try a case and present evidence to the court while also working to assist a hard working small business owner. It is an example and reminder of the system at work and the people that it effects.
- v. Whiteko v. Fayette County (United States District Court for the Western District of Pennsylvania; No. 2:20-cv-881); In this wrongful termination case, I represented Fayette County regarding the termination of a former Public Defender. This case was significant in that I was able to interact with the County and court staff, including certain judges who were deposed by Plaintiff in this case. The case settled prior to trial on very favorable terms, in my opinion, for the County.

I am a thorough attorney, and take great pride in my preparation of cases, review of the law, and application to the facts to the law that a case presents. I believe that I can take those attributes to the bench to fairly, positively, and expeditiously bring cases to conclusion for all litigants.

Besides our children, overcoming the death of my father at a young age (I was 11) and the death of my brother five years later. I have worked tirelessly to make them proud of me every day – taking advantage of the opportunities they were not fortunate enough to have. My father was an attorney and former president of the Allegheny County Bar Association who had aspirations, one day, for the bench. I understood from his example that I required time to hone my skills to be properly prepared for the bench. Although, I personally consider overcoming these life obstacles a great personal achievement, I acknowledge that there is still work to be done to better myself.

37. Please identify specific efforts you have made, or been involved with, to support equality and inclusion in the legal profession.

During my career, I was fortunate to be the head attorney for the oil and gas group of a law firm. In this regard, I had the opportunity to hire several individuals for the group. Keeping in mind my commitment, as well as the firm's commitment, to diversity and gender equality and inclusion in the legal profession, we hired a diverse group of five professionals consisting of four of women, one of which was African-American, and one male.

As a member of the bench as would be aware to let members of the bar know that diverse attorneys are welcome to practice in the Court and that firm management should do everything that they can to afford opportunity to a diverse and inclusive bar. I would be mindful to encourage diverse attorneys to practice before the Court in an equally welcoming way — to foster meaningful and professionally satisfying work experiences for a diverse and gender equal bar.
